Insights & Analysis

- Iowa Republicans are in a favorable position. The generic ballot (R—49%, D—40%, Unsure—11%) shows Republicans maintaining their 9-point lead from the 2022 post-Dobbs survey results. The presidential ballot has widened, with Trump now outperforming the generic.
 - **Generic Republicans lead by more than 20 points in competitive rural districts**, while high-income suburban districts (D+5) and middle-class suburban districts (R+3) are more tightly contested.
 - Democrats are winning independent voters (+16) and women over 65 (+13) – key voting groups for competitive suburban districts. Target them to increase ballot share.
- Since 2022, Trump’s image (48% fav, 50% unfav, 2% NO/NHO) has remained about the same, compared to Biden, whose net favorability dropped 4 points.
- Governor Kim Reynolds’ image is now three points underwater, and 45% of voters prefer a Democrat who would be a check on her agenda.
 - A plurality (47%) of voters in middle-class suburban districts and a majority (52%) of voters in high-income suburban districts prefer a Democrat who would be a check on Reynolds.
 - Use caution when leveraging Reynolds on behalf of Republicans in competitive districts.
- **Republicans in the legislature are viewed as net-favorable by 3 points, compared to Democrats, who are underwater by 8 points.**

Insights & Analysis

- In a head-to-head matchup, **voters *definitely* supporting Trump outpace the total number of voters supporting Biden by 2%.**
- Nearly a third of Iowans believe abortion should be illegal after 15 weeks, including most independents (41%).
 - Only women under 35 and Democrats are more likely to believe abortion should be legal until birth.
- **Two-thirds of voters believe abortion is less important than other issues,** and nearly half (48%) are willing to vote for a candidate with differing opinions on the issue.
 - A majority (56%) of those who would vote for a candidate they don't agree with plan to support the Republican candidate this November, suggesting GOP candidates may be able to withstand attacks from Democrats on this issue.
- A plurality (40%) of voters would vote for a Republican who will protect gun rights, and the issue will not hurt GOP candidates among independents, among whom nearly half (46%) say the issue has no impact on their vote.
- When it comes to specific actions state government should take, a plurality (37%) of voters believe reducing sales taxes on essential items is the best strategy for combating inflation—10% higher than the second choice.

Insights & Analysis

- **Of the seven possible actions provided, the top 5 included some form of tax relief.**
- A legislative package that includes the top 3 choices would resonate positively with voters in competitive districts.
- When considering which education issue is most important, voters are split between teacher pay raises (23%) and stopping woke indoctrination (23%).
 - A plurality (29%) of independents say teacher pay raises are their top priority, while voters in middle-class and high-income districts are split evenly.
- Over half (53%) of lowans believe we need to fund the existing public education system without expanding school choice.
 - High-income voters, who are the least likely to utilize the public education system, are the most likely to suggest improving it instead of offering school choice options.
- Almost two-thirds of voters disagree with Biden's recent Title IX rule change (>50% *strongly* disagree), and two-thirds agree the state needs to take action to maintain protections for biological women (>50% *strongly* agree).
 - **62% of undecided voters on the generic ballot agree** with legislation to ban biological men from participating in female sports or using women's bathrooms.

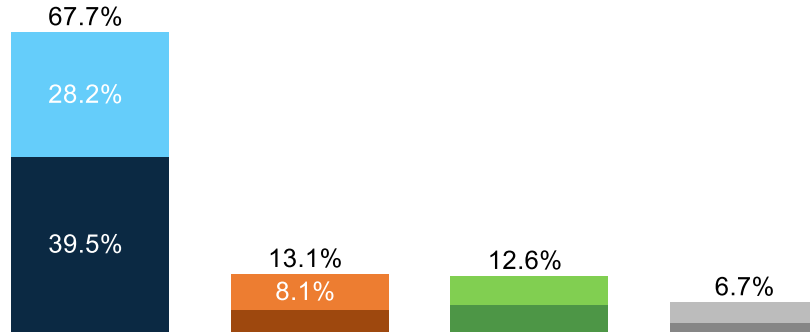
Insights & Analysis

- Almost two-thirds of independent voters and nearly 30% of those voting Democrat on the generic disagree with Biden's rule change, which makes this issue a perfect contrast message in competitive districts.

Segmentation analysis identified three groups via machine learning: GOP Base (45%), Dem Base (38%), and Independents (17%).

- Independents skew female (64%) and are the least likely to hold a college degree. They are the lowest propensity voters. Republicans lead by +14 on the generic ballot, and *Independents* are the most undecided segment. They are the most concentrated group on inflation as a top priority and reducing sales taxes for essential items as a state action. *Independents* are the most divided on education priorities, and they are the least likely to be concerned about gun control issues. A majority (56%) are willing to support a candidate with differing views on abortion.

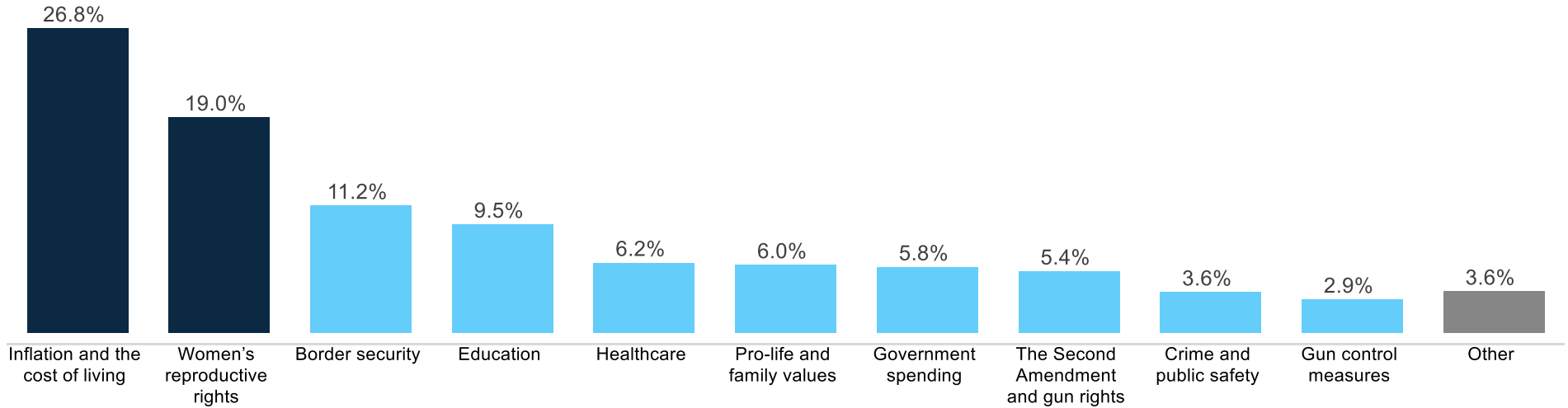

How do you plan to vote in the August 13th Republican primary election for U.S. Congress?

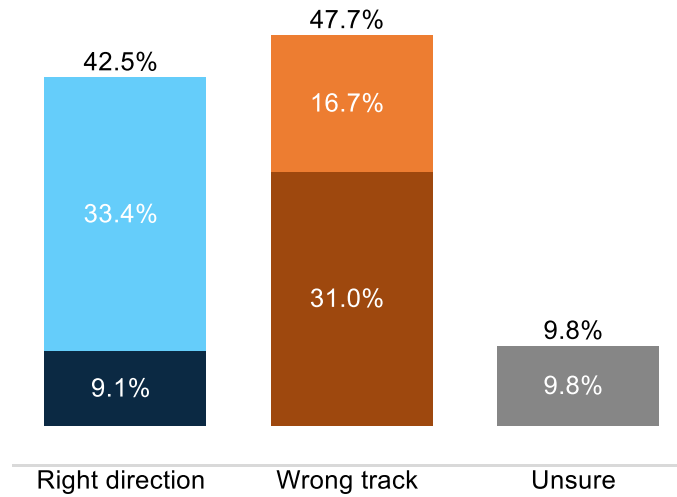

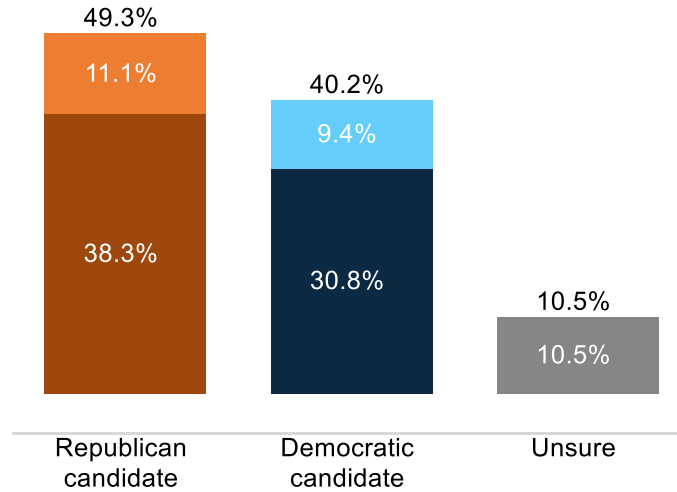

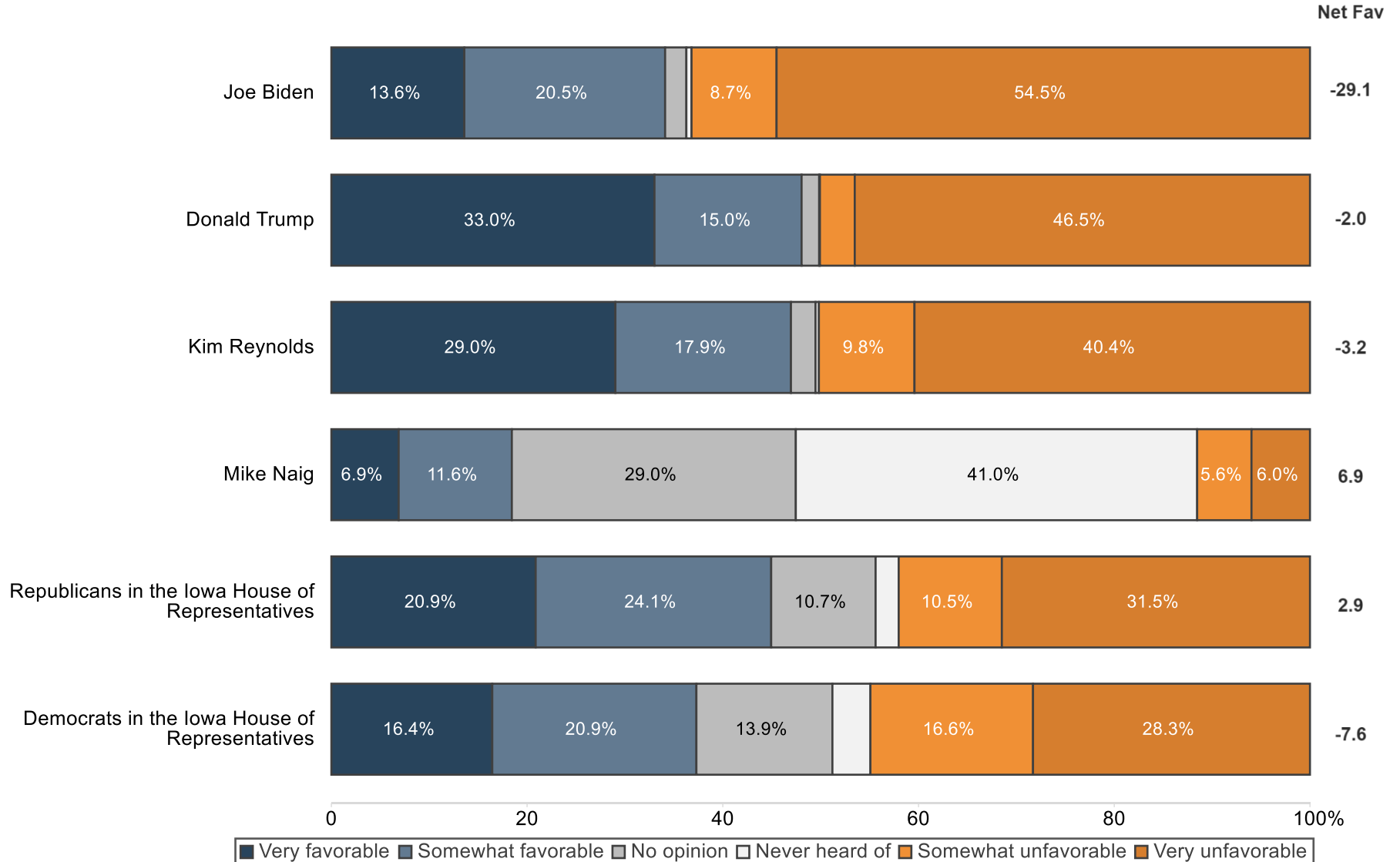

Do you have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of Joe Biden?

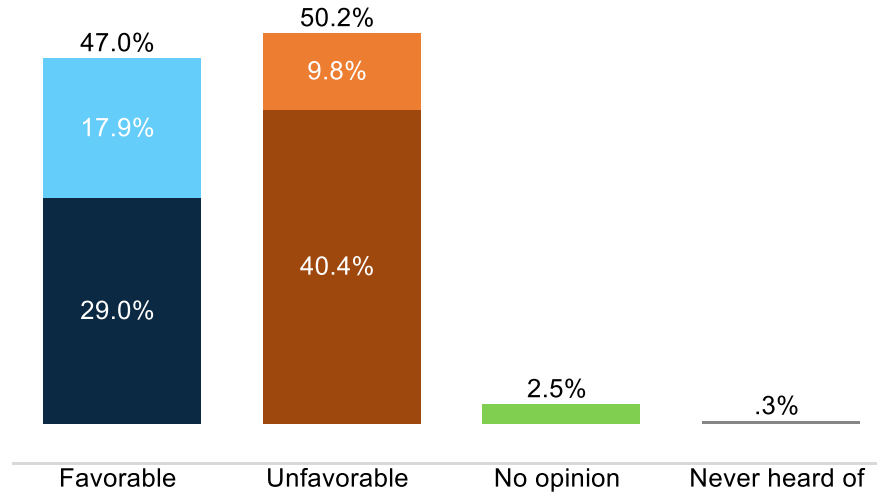

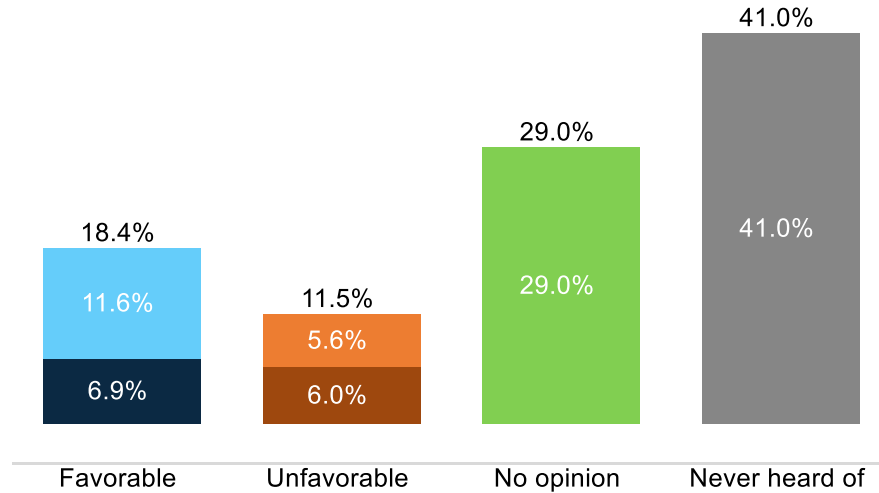

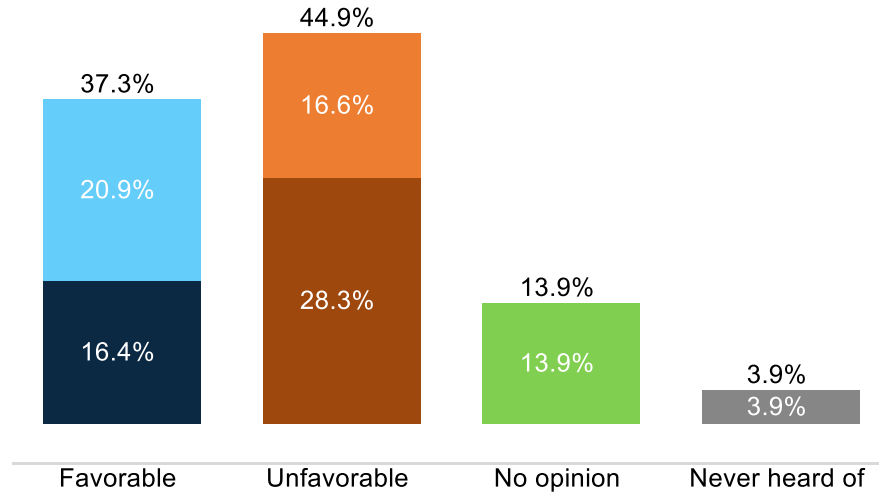

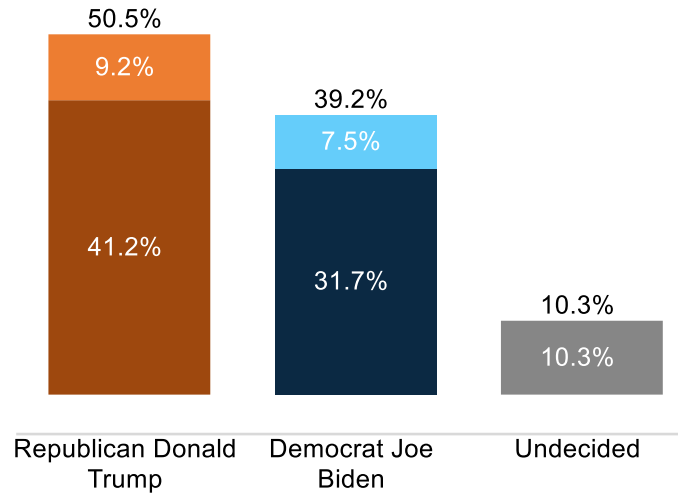

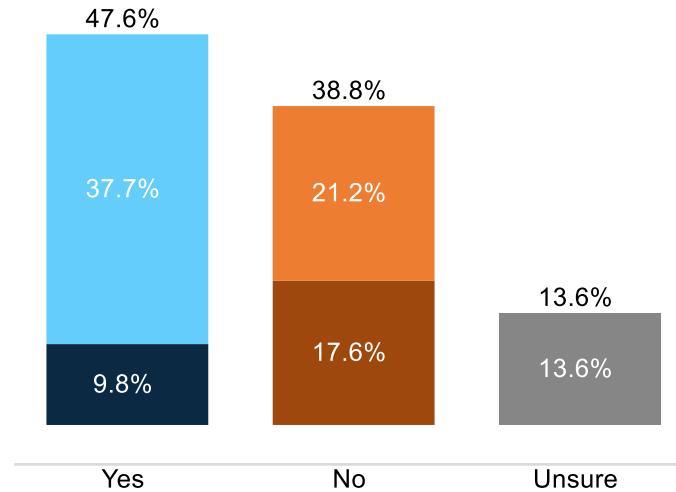

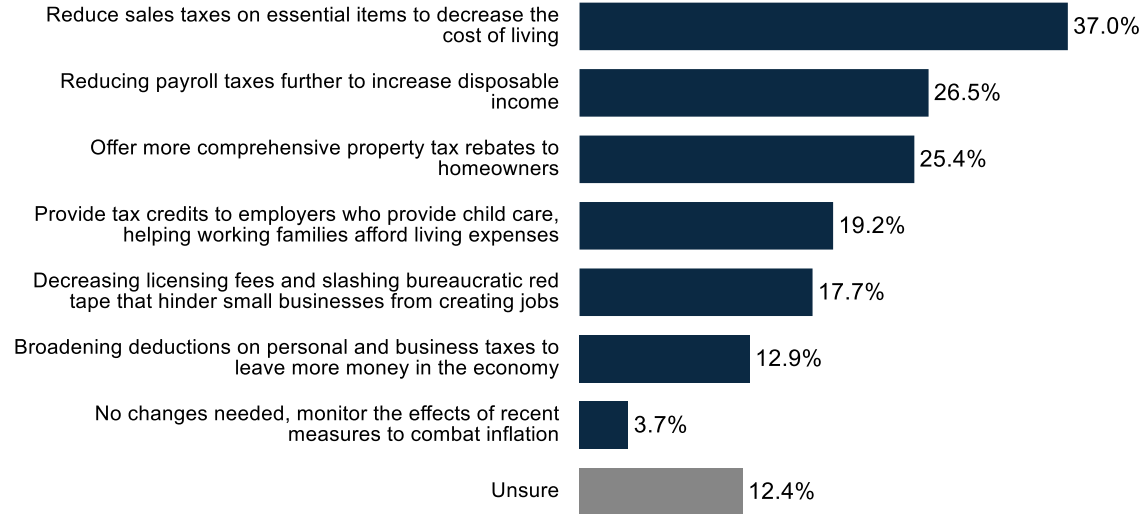

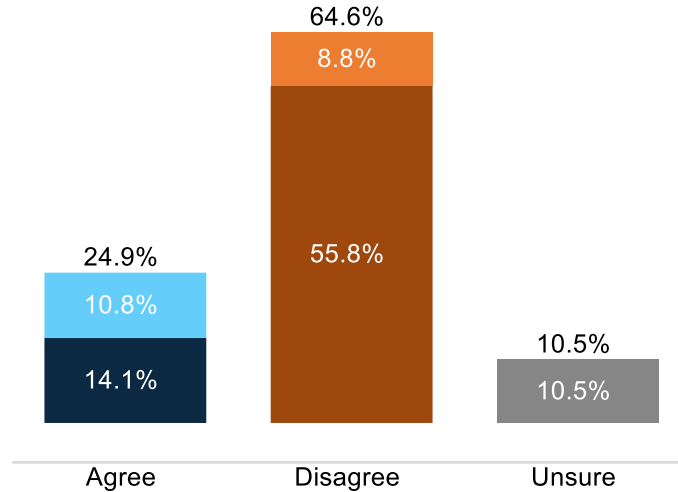
